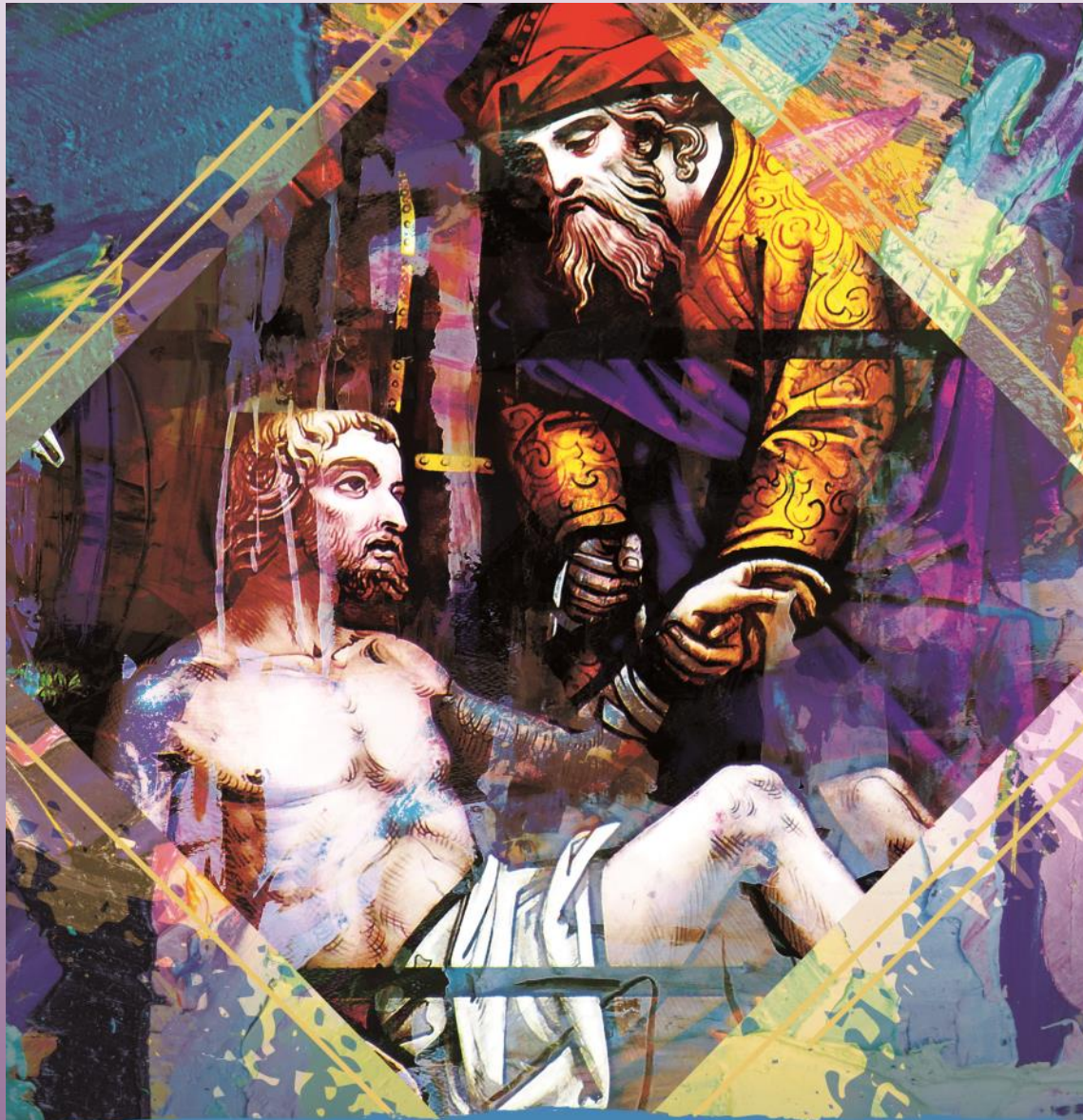



Nicene Creed

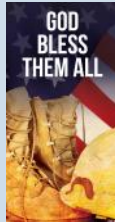

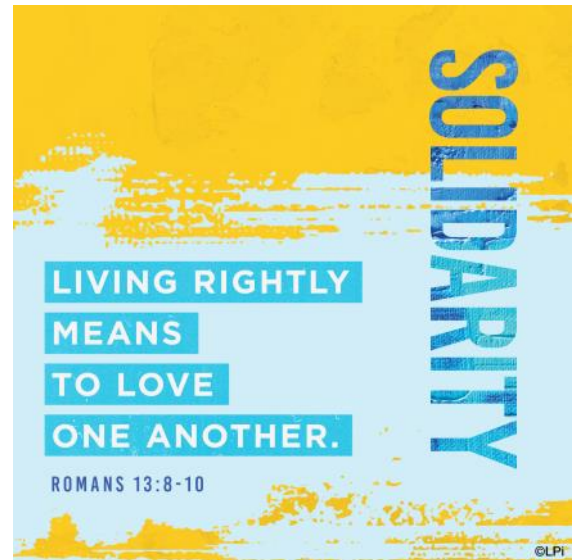

Bathroom Renovation

Update on Centre Restroom Renovations: The fruit of many meetings since last fall, the plan for the renovation of the Centre restrooms is now on display in the Centre. The Centre restrooms have basically not been touched since they were constructed about thirty years ago. They are long overdue for a major upgrade, including new lighting, plumbing, counters, cabinets, flooring and touchless equipment [such as faucets, soap dispensers, hand dryer, commodes, toilets] and more. Plans call for permit requests very soon; following this, a bid will be submitted by a contractor, narrowed down from three contractors. The work is expected to take about two months or less. During the process, alternative restrooms in our facility will be used.

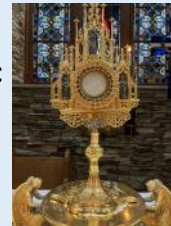


