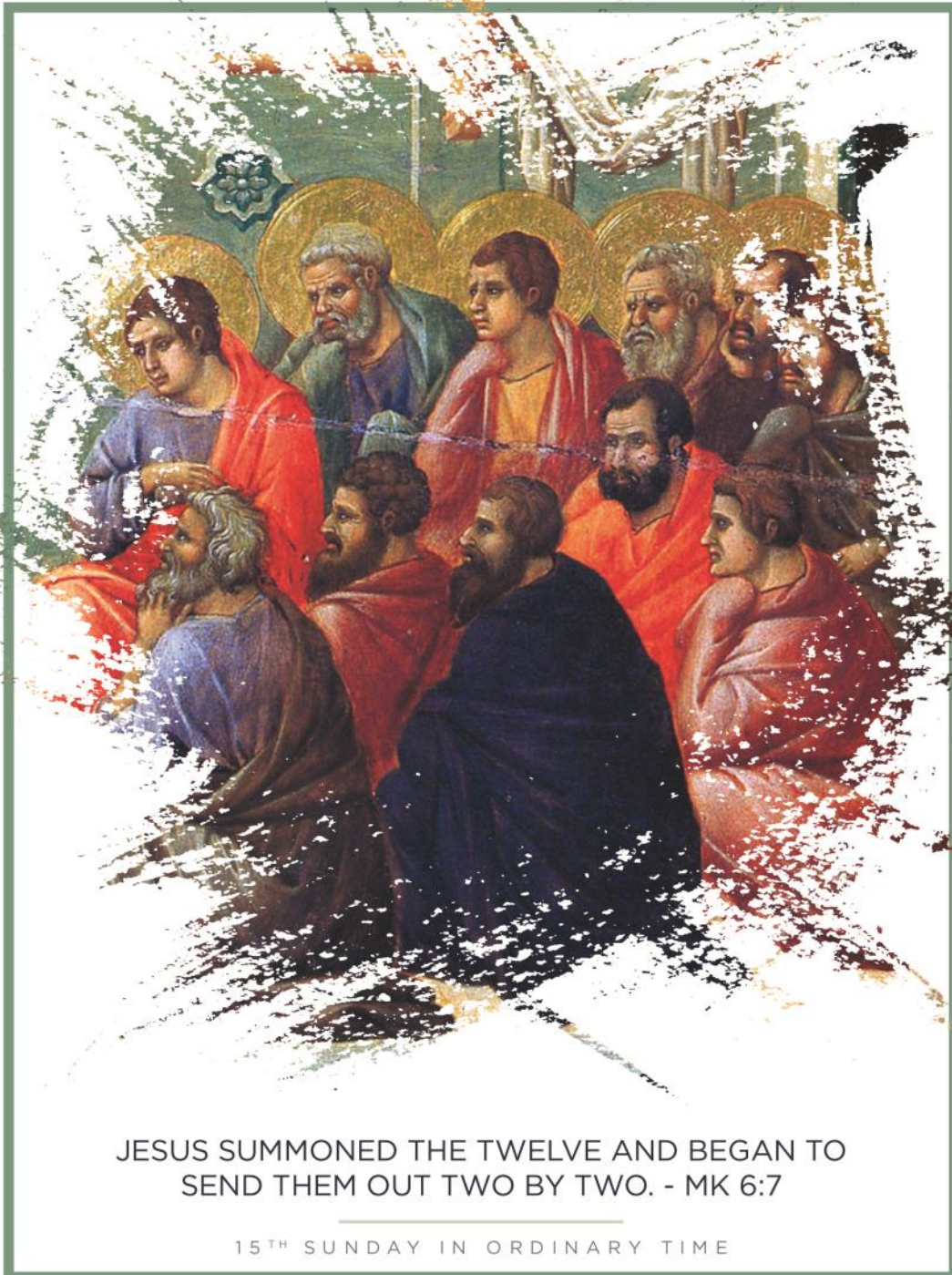



Dear Brothers and Sisters,
I hope this finds you well as we approach mid-July. Summertime affords us time to catch our breath and, hopefully, to get some relaxation. This summer locally is a busy one, getting ready for the fall as well as trying to address some major maintenance issues so that we can re-open many things this fall following the peak of the pandemic.



The operation of our beautiful facility is just like a home – on-going maintenance is a “given,” but on a much larger scale. Work continues on the area behind the church sanctuary. This extensive project was brought to your attention previously. Poor soils and poor concrete work contributed to the need for a new floor in the entire area. I am glad that it is being addressed; I am even happier that we had the funds to cover the \$93,000 expense. A claim was filed with the insurance company but was denied. Please note on pages 7 and 9 in the bulletin of our need to fill two maintenance positions – one for the “church” side and one for Cardinal Hickey Academy. These are two very important and critical staff positions. A lot depends on them for the operation of our large facility and the potential for so much social activity within it. By and large, our facility is fully open, save the Centre. Until we have a new maintenance person on board, the Centre remains generally closed. You can help by keeping this need in your prayers and by spreading the news of this need to others. Thank you!

We hear in today's Gospel that Jesus sends the Twelve apostles out to reach, teach, and heal. Consider what it must have been like for them to have spent all that time hearing the words spoken by Jesus and to have seen him heal people! Now, THEY are the ones preaching the Good News, teaching about the Kingdom, and healing others. We, too, have spent some time with the Word of God. We have experienced healing in the sacraments. How is God calling YOU to preach, teach, and heal in the world today?

Let us pray. God of all life and goodness, you call your disciples to live in community and to assist one another on the journey. Help us learn how to support each other on our mission, so that all your people may know the joy of the Good News. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

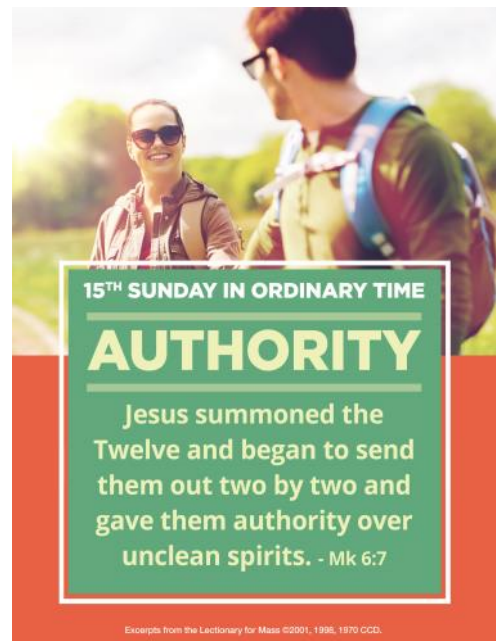
BAPTISMAL FONT UNDER REPAIR: It was recently discovered that our baptismal font in the church vestibule suffered some mechanical damage during the pandemic due to non-use. Estimates for repairs are underway. It is hoped to get the baptismal font up and running by the end of this summer.

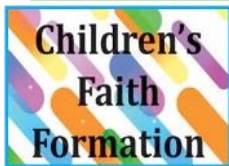

MAJOR REPAIR UNDERWAY: Inside our church, behind the altar/sanctuary area, are located the music ministry room, the church sacristy, a rest room and utility closet. Over the last year or so, the floor in the entire space has become unsafe due to sinking. This has created floor and cabinet instability. After inspection by archdiocesan and engineering experts, the causes that have been determined are poorly compacting soils over the years under the floor as well as poorly poured concrete when this area of the church was first constructed many years ago.

As a result, the entire area is closed until further notice. The repair will require "jack-hammering" the concrete floor, removal of soils, replacement with proper soils, new concrete, removal and replacement of all plumbing, walls, and flooring. This is a major project which will last the majority of the summer months at least. This repair cannot be covered by insurance [Catholic Mutual]. It will cost the parish about \$90,000 which will almost eliminate all of our savings for repairs.

The repair company will be working closely with us to accommodate the on-going use of the church. The church will not be affected. All scheduled events for the use of the church will take place as usual, including weddings and funerals. Thank you for your cooperation during this process!

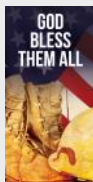

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

God calls us to bring His Word to all corners of the earth. What does that mean for you and me? We are just simple and humble folks trying to find our way through the Gospel and

our world. After all, we are not professional preachers but gentle servants. Jesus summons us to take his message on the road and bring it from the pew to the pavement. We cannot keep the joy of the Gospel to ourselves but must bring it into every aspect of our lives: our families, our schools, our work, our corporations, our politics, our social circles, and our philosophies. We cannot just accept the wisdom of the world as true and conduct our lives as if the Good News is a separate matter. They are one. Jesus never asked his friends to go and construct buildings where people could come to hear the truth. He asked them to go to their homes and meet them one on one, face to face. When the rubber meets the road and the message is challenging, rejection is quite possible. That's the litmus test for whether we're really doing what we have been asked. ©LPi

What does this ministry do? The Bereavement Ministry serves our Church and the families of our deceased during the funeral Mass and during the Annual Mass of Remembrance in November on All Souls Day.

What initially drew you to this ministry? When my Father passed away, I remember how comforting it was to be surrounded by loving and caring people within our Church. Losing a loved one is never easy and having a loving community there to offer a glass of water, assist the family prepare scripture readings or extend a hug is such a gift for grieving families.

What do love /enjoy most about this ministry? I love the solemnity of the Mass of Christian Burial, the respect and love shown to the family, the invitation to celebrate a life and the promise of eternal life.

The ministry is great for anyone who is available from time to time when called to serve for a couple of hours. We set up the Church, support our Pastor and Deacon, greet family and friends, answer questions, assist with the funeral and provide a presence and comfort to the family.

When are volunteer opportunities available? Volunteer opportunities are on-going, year round. Members and volunteers are notified several days prior to the funeral.

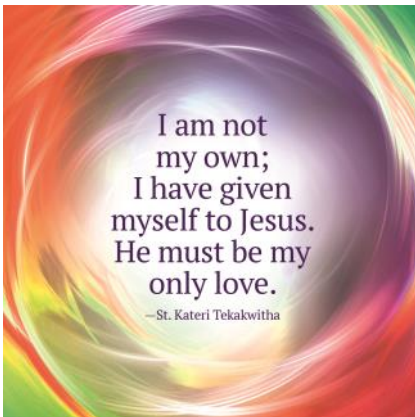
