

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Now that the Centre Restrooms have been successfully renovated, attention needs to be given to our kitchen. It is in critical need to be updated to conform to contemporary health and safety codes. The Kitchen Renovation Committee recently met to review the latest drawings and plans for the kitchen.

As was done for the Centre Restrooms, when the drawings are finalized, they will be shared with the community. As you can imagine, this is quite an undertaking, but one well worth it. The finished product will be a great gift to our community for many years to come. Please keep this project in your prayers.

Summertime allows us, too, to catch up on some much-needed maintenance tasks in our large facility. A drainage issue at the Grotto which has been a problem for years is being addressed and we expect that work to begin shortly. In August, we are installing our new set of outdoor Stations of the Cross, a gift from a family in our community. They will truly be a useful and attractive addition to our outdoors. We are also upgrading our rather "ancient" fire alarm system throughout our facility. This work is ex-

pected to take about 3-4 weeks. Fire Codes have also changed over the years. This new system will have all the "whistles and bells" to ensure our compliance and to maintain the safety of our beautiful facility.



## / For Your Safety

JGS has a gas stove and several gas fireplaces. Natural gas is a colorless, odorless fuel. For safety reasons, a chemical odorant called mercaptan is added for easy detection. This odorant has a distinctive "rotten egg" type scent. Natural gas odors should be reported right away. If you smell this odor, alert others and leave the area immediately, leave the doors open as you exit. Do not try to locate the source of the smell.
