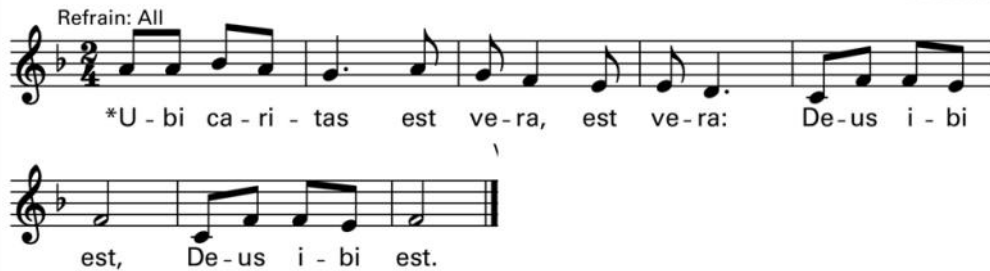

FOOD PANTRY UPDATE: Many thanks to JGS parishioners for your generous donations to the Ladies of Charity Food Pantry. The Food Pantry is a vital resource for our neighbors in need during this difficult time.

During the time period mid-March thru the end of June, the Food Pantry has served over 1200 households, representing nearly 3400 people. During that time nearly 26 tons (yes, tons!) of food were distributed. Comparing this year to last, during the same period there has been an increase of 46% in the total number of households served.

The Food Pantry continues to be open every Tuesday, one Wednesday evening and one Saturday morning a month and groceries are delivered to the Town Center Apartments monthly. The distribution model is still outdoors and will continue as long as necessary no matter what the weather!

Donations are always welcome! Food donations may be left on the cart at the JGS entrance or on the donation bench at the Food Pantry at any time. The Food Pantry is available to receive donations in person from 3:00 to 5:00 pm Tuesday thru Saturday. Monetary donations can be mailed to Ladies of Charity, PO Box 334, North Beach MD 20714.

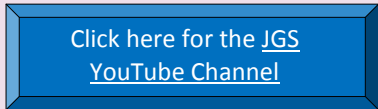
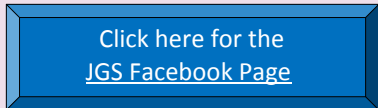

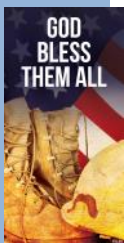
