





Happy end of July and a Happy Vigil of August! Despite the recent heat wave, I pray that you are enjoying the summer and that this summer affords you some time for rest and relaxation.



Sometimes when we read or hear the Scriptures, we are not always presented with easy stories. Today's liturgy is one such occasion. The first reading is a bit of a downer! Everything is vanity. It's all grief and sadness. Rest is elusive. Vanity! Vanity!

We shouldn't just dismiss the first reading as depressing or dramatic. The writer has something to say to us: things pass. All of our grief and anxiety, our work and knowledge – they come and go. So too with the joys that the first reading forgets to mention.

There is a difference between experiencing [feeling] an emotion and being overwhelmed or consumed by it. The latter is indeed vanity. Recognizing it as such can be helpful as we especially move through our summer days.

Let us pray. God of wisdom, you grant us a fleeting life on this earth. Open our hearts to love it fully; open our minds to live it wisely; open our hands to work through it peacefully. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.





UPDATE ON CENTRE RESTROOM RENOVATIONS: The fruit of many meetings since last fall, the plan for the renovation of the Centre restrooms is now on display in the Centre. The Centre restrooms have basically not been touched since they were constructed about thirty years ago. They are long overdue for a major upgrade, including new lighting, plumbing, counters, cabinets, flooring and touchless equipment [such as faucets, soap dispensers, hand dryer, commodes, toilets] and more. Plans call for permit requests very soon; following this, a bid will be submitted by a contractor, narrowed down from three contractors. The work is expected to take about two months or less. During the process, alternative restrooms in our facility will be used.


