# A HEARTFELT THANK YOU AND GOODBYE

FROM FATHER KEN: It's been a joyful, faithfilled, and thrilling experience for me to serve as "weekend clergy" at Jesus the Good Shepherd for the past 15 years. Now, sadly, I must say goodbye. I have received a new assignment from the Paulist Fathers, my religious community, and will be moving to California in July.

Our life's journey to heaven is a pilgrimage with many stops along the way. My next stop is a one-year sabbatical where I will be in residence at the Paulist Newman Hall/Holy Spirit Parish near the University of California at Berkeley. During my sabbatical I will continue to lead a team developing the Catholic Discipleship Profile, a project I have been part of for the past year at Paulist Evangelization Ministries, my current Paulist assignment in Washington, DC. We are creating the CDP to help Catholics assess their experience of living as a Catholic disciple of Jesus, which involves affirming their strengths as disciples and discovering new ways to grow in holiness and mission.

I am most grateful to Fr. Mike King for inviting me to come to Jesus the Good Shepherd in July 2005 and assist him as weekend clergy. I had been helping Fr. Mike for about a year and a half in his previous assignment as Pastor of St. Columba Parish in Oxen Hill, MD. Saying "yes" to his invitation to come to Jesus the Good Shepherd was an easy decision. Fr. Mike is a gifted priest and a loving and caring pastor.

Serving as weekend clergy at Jesus the Good Shepherd has been a highlight of my priesthood. It's one thing to talk about the qualities of a Spirit-filled parish, and it's another to be part of one. What I enjoyed most about serving at JGS is connecting with people: the talented pastor and staff, those serving selflessly in the various ministries and organizations, and all the people I have come to know and love who make up this inspiring community of faith. I saw powerful evidence of the Spirit at work here, which increased my faith and confidence in Christ.

Please know of my prayers for you and my immense gratitude to God for being with you as we journeyed in faith together. Always let the light of Christ continue to shine brightly at the Covenant Community of Jesus the Good Shepherd. May the peace of Christ be with you.

PARKING LOT PAVING: Plans are underway to complete the last phase of our large parking lot repairing and repaving which began last summer. The area under consideration is towards the Pavilion and behind the church. This final phase is able to be completed due to the generosity of our members and careful savings for this purpose since last summer. The paving company assures us that this last phase of paving will take place during this month of July.

During the repairing and repaving, there should be no interruption to the flow of traffic. The final cost of repairing and repaving the entire parking lot comes to \$124,340. This, of course, would not have happened with your financial support through our Sunday offertory. We depend very heavily on our Sunday offertory to not only make ends meet but to save for on-going, future maintenance expenditures. Our deepest thanks to all for their faithful financial generosity to our parish. Your financial gifts allow us to do such things as to repair and repave our parking lot.

DAILY MASS, JULY 14-16: Please note that daily Mass will take place in the Centre which allows for social distancing while some electrical work will be done in the church. Some of our senior members may recall that prior to the present church being built, Sunday Mass was celebrated in the Centre for years. If you plan on attending daily Mass these days in the Centre, we hope you enjoy this "nostalgic trip" down "memory lane!"

JGS is ultimately concerned with the safety and well being of our community. We have made necessary precautions and followed local county, state, and archdiocesan guidelines during the re-opening of the church. We have trained volunteers from our parish continuing to sanitize after Masses (if you would like to volunteer, let the church office know, we could use more help).
