Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Wow! We find ourselves this weekend already half-way through August! Where does time go? For students of all ages, this means preparations are now underway for returning to school. For some of our young adults, this means going off to college — many in our



community for the first time. Our prayers and best wishes are with you!

As fall approaches, we all need to develop a new "SENSE OF BELONGING" to the active practice of our Catholic faith — simple steps like returning to Mass and being connected to our community, our family of faith here at Jesus the Good Shepherd.

For those who have been away, mainly due to the pandemic, a return to Mass in-person should regain a sense of "belonging." By our nature, we are social. As disciples of Jesus, we are called together as a community, as a family of faith.

While I understand some may still be wedded to attending Mass "virtually," it is not the same as attending Mass in person. Have some become too comfortable in attending Sunday Mass "virtually?" For one, when one participates in Mass in the comfort of one's home, one is separated from one's "Church" family and one cannot receive the Eucharist. Coming to Mass highlights Sunday as the "Day of the Lord." Sadly, many treat Sunday as just another day of the week. But for us as Catholics, Sunday has special meaning. It is truly the Lord's Day — to worship God, to gather as a community and family of believers, and to receive the Holy Eucharist.

As students across all age groups return to "belonging" to a particular school or university, let's all return to where we belong as "Catholics" – to Sunday Mass, giving our God the highest form of worship that we can offer Him as Catholics – the Sunday Eucharist. God bless you!

UPDATE ON CENTRE RESTROOM RENOVATIONS: The fruit of many meetings since last fall, the plan for the renovation of the Centre restrooms is now on display in the Centre. The Centre restrooms have basically not been touched since they were constructed about thirty years ago. They are long overdue for a major upgrade, including new lighting, plumbing, counters, cabinets, flooring and touchless equipment [such as faucets, soap dispensers, hand dryer, commodes, toilets] and more. Plans call for permit requests very soon; following this, a bid will be submitted by a contractor, narrowed down from three contractors. The work is expected to take about two months or less. During the process, alternative restrooms in our facility will be used.




