We hear in today's second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews: "So strengthen your drooping hands and your weak knees. Make straight paths for your feet, that what is lame may not be disjointed but healed."

After an injury or a surgery, the process of physical rehab can be often very slow and painful. To regain strength, a strong commitment to doing the necessary exercises and accepting guidance from a rehab specialist are essential.




