

Dear Brothers and sisters,

Despite the pandemic, it is exciting to see many things “starting up” in parish life! In particular, all students returning to school on every education level are in our prayers. It is indeed a challenging time. “Together, we will get through it!” Let us continue to pray for one another!



We hear in today’s Gospel of the commissioning of Jesus to Peter to lead His Church: “And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven.”

The Church has long regarded this passage as the foundational moment for the establishment of the ministry of the pope as head of the Church. The symbol of “keys” appears in the papal crest, the sign both of governance and of leadership that is rooted in the person of Jesus Christ.

Peter, the rock, symbolizes that the human community that is the Church, rests on the permanence of its divine foundation. Although Jesus commissions Peter to a ministry of reconciliation, that same mandate is given to all his disciples. The strength of the Church today depends on a communion of love, justice and mercy among all of the baptized.

Let us pray. Eternal God, you have never withheld your mercy and your pardon to the contrite of heart. Bestow upon your people a burning desire to bring that same compassion into a world that needs healing, reconciliation and peace. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

To stand in the presence of God is to stand in the presence of incomprehensible mystery. We are people of proofs and facts. With good reason, we are becoming more doubtful of what presents itself to us, as technology makes it easy to fabricate false images and distort what is actually true. What we think is real actually may not be. We become skeptical. Does this skepticism affect our relationship with God? To have faith in God means that we must be willing to trust in the absence of full knowledge. To know the mind of God means we would know God himself, and that is impossible. To acknowledge Jesus as the Christ means we acknowledge that the reality and presence of an incarnate God has a fundamental claim on who we are. When we name this truth, we participate in a depth of knowledge that stretches us far beyond the scope of our minds. It brings us to silence, which is the only way to touch our soul. ©LPi

2020 ANNUAL APPEAL: Our community has reached about 70% of our goal for the Annual Appeal. This is wonderful news and we are grateful to all those who have made a pledge. However, due to the distraction of the pandemic, a regular "follow-up" campaign during Sunday Mass was not able to occur due to the cancellation of public Masses which have resumed only recently. The needs of the most poor, the most vulnerable, and those serving in a variety of ministries throughout the Archdiocese of Washington, however, remain. INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITY FOR UNDERGRAD STUDENTS: Current undergraduate students looking for a remote internship opportunity are invited to apply to the Outreach and Events Intern at Catholic Charities D.C. for the Fall semester. The intern will work with our Volunteer Engagement Office to and will be responsible for project coordination and communication with our volunteers. This is a good position for someone interested in developing skills in community outreach, event coordination, and learning more about large non-profits. AIR FLOW IN THE CHURCH: During the pandemic, some have made an understandable inquiry about the *air quality* in our church. All HVAC systems for Cardinal Hickey Academy, the church and our entire facility are already equipped with outside-fresh air intake dampers. These electronically-controlled dampers allow for an intake of fresh air at all times. The present air filters are classified as "high efficient" pleated filters. They are replaced every 90 days per the maintenance schedule. There are other upgrades but they are not under consideration at this time. First, given what we have at present, they are not needed; second, the costs for such run high. If we upgrade to what is called a *HEPA filter*, the cost is \$2,600, without the labor charge. There are also *ultra violet germicidal irradiation* [UVGI] light kits. These would have to be installed within the ductwork of each system. This would cost approximately \$16,485 which includes labor.
