



## Second Reading: Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19

Brothers and sisters:  
Faith is the realization of what is hoped for  
and evidence of things not seen.  
Because of it the ancients were well at-  
tested.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was  
called to go out to a place  
that he was to receive as an inheritance;  
he went out, not knowing where he was  
to go.

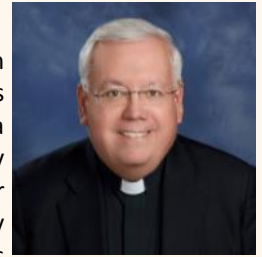

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

With August underway, this month promises to be a very busy one as preparations are underway for a wonderful Fall here at JGS. 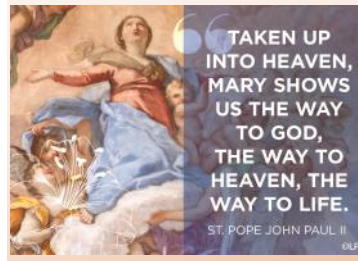

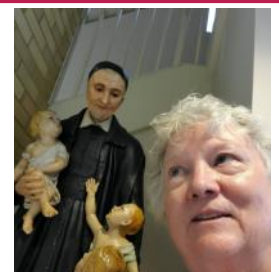

**UPDATE ON CENTRE RESTROOM RENOVATIONS:** The fruit of many meetings since last fall, the plan for the renovation of the Centre restrooms is now on display in the Centre.
