





LIVE THE LITURGY INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Are we willing to be taught by God? If we are, then we will begin to see things and make judgments using a Divine lens. Often, we perceive things with

purely human eyes and reference points. When we do this, reality can lose its Divine spark and we miss what God is trying to say. When using human eyes exclusively, Jesus is at best perceived simply as a prophet who has some wise things to say. The human element has a difficult time seeing Jesus' divinity and recognizing him as the Bread of Life that comes down from heaven. We can easily get stuck on Jesus' human associations and overlook the marvelous wonders God wants us to see. If we really allow ourselves to be taught by God, we will then come to see the truth about Jesus and the abundant everlasting life God offers. Jesus becomes the key that unlocks all of our relationships: with God, others, ourselves, and creation. He, as the true and lasting bread from heaven, shows us the gifts of faith, hope, and love that God bestows on us. Through this divine lens we see that all life sparkles and glows with God's love.

MAJOR CHURCH REPAIRS NEARING COMPLETION: Around Labor Day weekend, it is expected all activity will resume to the area behind the church which has been closed for several months due to repairs.

As a church ages, it is no different from any building or home. This October marks the 24th anniversary of the dedication of our beautiful church. When constructed, there were the usual checks and balances, all building codes were met and all approvals given.

Over time, like any building, there are often "settlement issues" which occur, unrelated to the original construction. If you are a homeowner, you are probably well aware of this situation.

In this case, sections of the floor, as previously reported, became unsafe and gradually separated from the walls, around 3" deep in some sections. This was due to deteriorating compacting soils in that area, again which occurred over time, thus affecting the adjoining concrete in these same locations. This, in turn, led to cracks in walls which in turn led to moisture getting into the walls which also resulted in mold/mildew issues.

As of this writing, most of the major repair work has been completed. Thanks be to God that we will be able to resume activity in these areas. Especially to our liturgical ministers, thank you for your patience and understanding as we soon transition back from our temporary storage areas back to our unified space. It will be great once we are up and running!

INFANT BAPTISM AND GODPARENTS: The *Rite of Baptism for Children* calls for at least one Godparent to be Catholic. A Catholic godparent is not only present for the actual baptism, a name on a baptismal certificate or a person in a baptism photo, *but stands as a role model of the Catholic faith* — a kind of "spiritual coach" if you will. It is hoped that as a young child matures and grows, that child will be inspired and encouraged by the Catholic godparent to joyfully practice and embrace the Catholic Faith

Baptized Catholics asked to be godparents who have no active relationship with God, with the Catholic Church, and/or do not embrace faithfully the obligation to attend Mass cannot serve as godparents, as these habits are contrary to the Church. In such cases, godparents are and will be declined. In all cases, candidates for godparents must supply a letter of approval from their pastors. A pastor is not obligated to give written approval if these conditions are not met.

If baptized Catholics in such cases wish to develop a relationship with God, re-establish ties with with the Catholic Church, re-establish regular attendance at weekend Mass and prove such over a period of time, as well as receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation with firm resolve to return to the active practice of the Catholic Faith, they are most welcome to be godparents.

We kindly remind all parents anticipating the baptism of a child as well as prospective godparents to keep these items in mind. Thank you.
