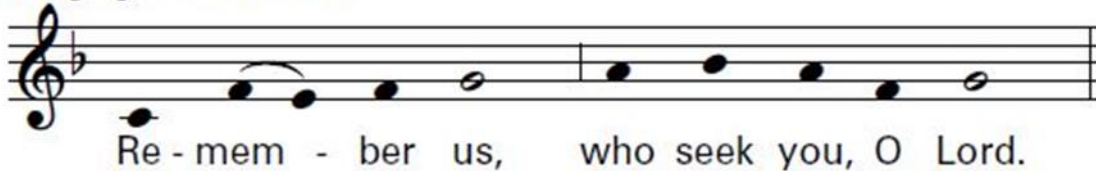
Worship Aid and Bulletin

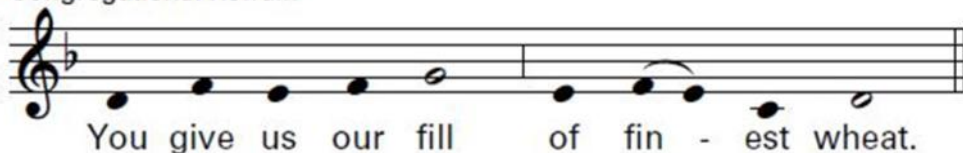

As a sign of our on-going preparations for the fall, I am happy to share with our broader community that our regional Catholic elementary school, **Cardinal Hickey Academy**, will re-open Tuesday, August 25, 2020, with both in-school and virtual learning. Plans are also being finalized for the re-opening of our **Children's Faith Formation** Program [CFF]. We are also excited about this for the coming school year. In regards to the many other parish groups who utilize our meeting spaces, it is highly recommended where possible that serious consideration be given, if not already, to going "virtual." This is presently available, weather permitting, provided the usual health protocols are respected.

I am certainly open to this possibility. It is under consideration at this time. Before a decision is made, a broader consultation will be made when a plan can be shared and then a more fully-informed decision can be made. Stay tuned in the weeks to come to hear more about our plans for *Covenant Sunday*!

Speaking of which, today's gospel is about the miraculous feeding of the multitude! This was a defining moment in the public ministry of Jesus. His compassion for the crowd leads to an abundance of blessings, symbolized in the twelve baskets left over.
