I am so much looking forward to our “covid-safe” celebration of Covenant Sunday next Sunday at 11 a.m. Granted, it will look different from years past, but at least we are doing our best to respect all health protocols while coming together as God’s family. Today’s reading is one of several in Matthew’s account of the Gospel known as the “Kingdom parables.” The full parable includes the master’s choice to pay all the workers the same wage.

The first part of the parable tells us that the Lord invites whomever he chooses to work in his vineyard. The labor of all who are invited is needed, just as the gifts of all are needed, for the work of the Kingdom.

The choice is the Lord’s, not ours. So too, the reward of discipleship is not governed by OUR sense of fairness by the generosity of the Lord. We are simply grateful to be invited!

In every age, O God, you have called forth men and women to spread the Good News of salvation. Instill in us the virtue of charity for the well-being of all our brothers and sisters, that they might come to know your kindness and rejoice in the salvation you have promised. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen!

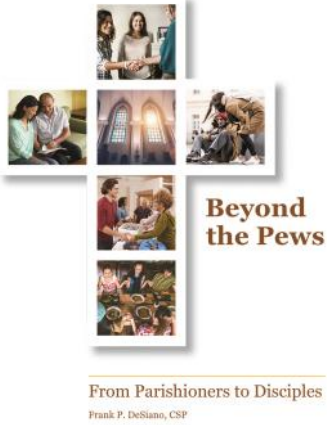
Covenant Prayer

2020 ANNUAL APPEAL: As of August 15, JGS has reached 82% of its goal. Given the times, this is excellent news! A sincere thank you to all who have made a pledge/given. AIR FLOW IN THE CHURCH: During the pandemic, some have made an understandable inquiry about the *air quality* in our church. All HVAC systems for Cardinal Hickey Academy, the church and our entire facility are already equipped with outside-fresh air intake dampers. These electronically-controlled dampers allow for an intake of fresh air at all times. The present air filters are classified as "high efficient" pleated filters. They are replaced every 90 days per the maintenance schedule. There are other upgrades but they are not under consideration at this time. First, given what we have at present, they are not needed; second, the costs for such run high. If we upgrade to what is called a *HEPA filter*, the cost is \$2,600, without the labor charge. There are also *ultra violet germicidal irradiation [UVGI]* light kits. These would have to be installed within the ductwork of each system. This would cost approximately \$16,485 which includes labor.
