Since I last wrote my short column for our weekly bulletin, prayer needs abound: the aftermath of the earthquake in Haiti, the loss of our service men and women and innocent Afghans in Afghanistan, the homeless situation of Afghans flown to our country now seeking a new life and, of this writing, the



good people of Louisiana hit hard by the latest hurricane. Various families in our community have recently lost loved ones also. Let us especially keep them in our thoughts and prayers during this difficult time. We pray that the Holy Spirit, the Holy Comforter, the Consoler, will be with them and give them some sense of the peace of Christ and awareness that God is with them.

How appropriate, then, is today's Gospel. Jesus opened the ears of the deaf man and commanded that his tongue be freed from its obstruction. Jesus is NOT afraid to get his hands dirty! He reaches into the man's ears and touches his tongue. His contact is physical. He wholly gives of himself to transform the woundedness of others.

We, in our brokenness, are called to do the same. We must encounter and draw close to those who are weak; in doing so, we hasten the coming of the Kingdom. In baptism, Jesus touches our ears and mouth so that we might be opened to hear and proclaim the Good News to every person in every situation.

Let us pray. Loving God, you surround us with your love and presence. Help us as we approach the obstacles of this day and of this time in which we live. Remind us of the "bigger picture" to always see Your Presence, joy and kindness as we face many difficulties. We ask

this through Christ our Lord. Amen.




