



I wish you God's blessing during this month of September!

Needless to say, as we approach the November elections, we will be hearing a lot via social media about politics and diversity of candidates. It is also important for us as Catholics to familiarize ourselves where candidates stand on a variety of issues which



affect our Catholic Faith. A few things which you may find helpful:

First, what is most important is to make sure to vote! This cannot be underestimated. Even if one works, Maryland state law now allows employees to have two hours off to vote without incurring any penalty. So, it is good now to make plans to vote.

Second, as Catholics, we are not wanting in resources to guide us as Catholics in the voting booth. Among them are: Faithful Citizenship of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops [USCCB] and Open Wide our Hearts [USCCB letter on Racism], to begin naming a few. As Marylanders, all of us should be aware of the excellent website of the Maryland Catholic Conference which is also very helpful.

Today's Gospel speaks to us about forgiveness. Forgiveness can often be difficult. Whether we seek forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance/Reconciliation or attempt to be reconciled with someone whom we have hurt, it can be an emotional struggle.

Jesus' exhortation in today's reading describes reconciliation as both an individual act and a communal practice. When someone sins against us, we are called upon to meet that person face to face. If that does not lead to reconciliation, we should involve others who can help to restore a bond of communion.

However, the first step is a desire in our heart to be reconciled, to restore peace and to live in freedom from our sin.

Let us pray. Ever-loving and merciful God, you have brought forgiveness of sin to your faithful through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. Help us to be bearers of that same compassion to those we have sinned against to rejoice in your forgiveness for our own transgressions. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

May God's blessings be abundantly yours during this month of September.

NEW COORDINATOR FOR RCIA/AFF [ADULT FAITH FORMATION]: We are pleased to announce that JGS parishioner, Liz Parker, has accepted the position to serve as our new RCIA coordinator and, also, Coordinator for Adult Faith Formation. A graduate of The Catholic University of America, Liz brings with her many talents to her new position in service to our community. She will begin September 8th.

Please welcome Liz to her new position. We are already blessed, without any real advertising, with a short list of RCIA candidates for next year. We hope that this list will grow! It is expected that the RCIA will begin most likely in early October and, for the time being, be – like many other meetings – "virtual." Please keep the success of both our RCIA and AFF ministries in your prayers.

THE IMPORTANCE OF SILENCE DURING THE MASS: Many are not aware that at certain points during the Mass, the Church requires that there be periods of *silence*. Such periods allow the assembly to reflect on what was just proclaimed especially during the Liturgy of the Word. The Introduction to the *Lectionary* which contains the Scripture readings we use at Mass states: "The liturgy of the word must be celebrated in a way that fosters meditation; clearly, any sort of haste that hinders recollection must be avoided. The dialogue between God and His people taking place through the Holy Spirit demands short intervals of silence, suited to the assembled congregation, as an opportunity to take the word of God to heart and to prepare a response to it in prayer.

"Proper times for silence during the liturgy of the word are, for example, before the liturgy begins after the first and the second reading, after the homily" [#28].In light of the above, Jesus the Good Shepherd will be

making a greater effort for periods of greater silence as described above. All our cantors, musicians and lectors have been informed of such. May we all listen more carefully and not be rushed in listening to God who speaks to us through His Word. Thank you.

The Catholic University of America, located in Washington, D.C., is the national university of the Catholic Church. Founded in 1887, CUA offers stu-

dents an excellent education in a faith-filled atmosphere that is grounded in the Catholic intellectual tradition. The collection for The Catholic University of America underwrites scholarships to assist financially deserving students in completing their education at CUA in over 50 disciplines.

AIR FLOW IN THE CHURCH: During the pandemic, some have made an understandable inquiry about the air quality in our church. All HVAC systems for Cardinal Hickey Academy, the church and our entire facility are already equipped with outside-fresh air intake dampers. These electronically-controlled dampers allow for an intake of fresh air at all times. The present air filters are classified as "high efficient" pleated filters. They are replaced every 90 days per the maintenance schedule.

There are other upgrades but they are not under consideration at this time. First, given what we have at present, they are not needed; second, the costs for such run high. If we upgrade to what is called a HEPA filter, the cost is \$2,600, without the labor charge. There are also ultra violet germicidal irradiation [UVGI] light kits. These would have to be installed within the ductwork of each system. This would cost approximately \$16,485 which includes labor.






